The Influence of Culture on the Developing Child

The Long Reach of the Great Emancipation in the Lives of American Children by Clement A. Price

As we approach the sesquicentennial of the Emancipation Proclamation in January 2013, Dr. Price will draw our attention to its historical impact on children in western society. He will discuss the continued effect of the Emancipation Proclamation on how we raise and educate our children in the United States.

Dr. Price will emphasize the influence of culture historically and presently on our children. He will highlight the emancipation of child slaves and the role of children in the civil rights movement. Dr. Price will connect current, popular culture to its effects on children specifically in the realm of policy, legislation, education and the media.

Culture Change and Emotional Development in Immigrant Children

Dr. Inclán will present a theoretical model that embraces culture as a dynamic force in human development. His presentation will focus on the impact of culture on the child's identity formation and family relationships.

Dr. Inclán will describe the contrasting cultural messages presented to children (especially immigrant and/or minority) by different systems family, community, school, etc.- and the developmental conflicts they may cause by describing the protective and risk factors in immigrant children's development.

American Diversity Through the Eyes of a Black and Jewish Woman by Rain Pryor

Rain Pryor, the daughter of the late actor Richard Pryor and astronomer/writer, Shelly R. Bonus, is a dynamic speaker and award winning actress who reflects on her eclectic mix of Judaism and African American roots throughout her work.

In her one-woman, celebrated Off-Broadway show, "Fried Chicken and Latkes," Ms. Pryor recalls her life as the conflicted daughter of a celebrated black father and a Jewish mother with sensitivity and humor.

Ms. Pryor hopes conference participants walk away with the ability to see one another (without preconceptions) and cultivate communities of support and understanding. "We are all but one race, human!," says Ms. Pryor.
