<p>Applicants must be an active student in an accredited doctoral program in psychology (counseling, clinical, school) and must be approved for their internship by their university department prior to screening. In addition to being enrolled in a doctoral program, the initial screening of applicants is based on several factors, including: hours and type of practicum experience, assessment experience, and recommendation letters. Our selection criteria include a minimum of 1000 total practicum hours, including those expected from the applicant's current placement. We also expect that each applicant has at least one practicum providing treatment for children and families and preferably at least one experience providing play therapy for an individual child. Applicants to the bilingual track must be fluent in Spanish and able to provide therapy in both English and Spanish. Our assessment requirements include the completion of at least 10 Wechsler tests (WWPSI-IV, WISC-V, WAIS-IV) and at least three Rorschach/projective tests or other measures of personality assessment. Applicants must include a testing report in their application. Lastly, applicants must provide at least three letters of recommendation with at least one being from a clinical supervisor.</p>
